
Butterfly Boutique

DEI+B **SPOTLIGHT**

In the fall of 2022 the DEI+B ad hoc committee set out to understand the makeup of our League and where we could improve. During our first meeting we collaboratively wrote the mission statement of the committee, "The mission of the Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, & Belonging (DEI&B) committee is to identify, develop, and implement sustainable goals and metrics of DEI&B into the Junior League of Huntsville. Through focused volunteerism, cooperative collaborations, and the solidarity of our sisterhood, we are commissioned to advocate for and maintain diverse and inclusive community involvement opportunities and league experiences". We met throughout 2022 and 2023 to formulate questions that were eventually implemented into the Strategic Plan Survey. Based on answers from the survey we recommended the committee receive a full placement with a chair on the Board of Directors. The League voted on this recommendation and it was passed. The first DEI+B chair will be on the Junior League of Huntsville Board of Directors in in 2023-2024 League Year.


GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS 2023
