November GMM

Our **November General Membership Meeting** was held on November 5th at First United Methodist Church. **Dr. Amanda Barnes**, of [HealthSource Chiropractic of Hampton Cove](#), sponsored the meeting. Members heard an informative presentation by **Pat McCay, ED**, [North Alabama Human Trafficking Task Force](#). Pat highlighted how this issue has exploded in the region, elaborated on different forms of human trafficking, and shared tips for how to recognize and report crimes that may be occurring in our community. **Children First Chair Natalie Huff** shared an update on supply donations including over 3,500 boxes of peanut butter crackers collected. She showed an example of a food pack and described the packing process. **Butterfly Chair Katie Bouldin** presented a member recognition award to Butterfly committee member **Shelby Coates**. We heard a moving letter of appreciation from the Huntsville Hospital NICU staff following the Provisional Class's first NICU meal. Hollie Brockman presented the Junior League of Huntsville with a \$55,000 grant on behalf of the Lambert Foundation. Members enjoyed social hour at [Old Town Beer Exchange](#) following the meeting.



JLH Awarded The Lucille & Bruce Lambert Charitable Foundation Grant

"The Lucille & Bruce Lambert Charitable Foundation was established to provide grants and funding to help with community projects in memory of the Lambert and Brockman families. With the Foundation we try to be involved with organizations in our local communities, as well as our larger projects."



"Last summer after relocating to Huntsville from Indianapolis, I was looking into local organizations when I found the Junior League of Huntsville. After thoroughly reading the website I called as a potential new member. Not only did I think it would

be a good fit for the Foundation, but I was also interested on a personal level. But I wanted to see how they treated new people before they knew a potential grant was in the mix.

"My first phone call was with **Hayley Lamberth**, who at the time was the Membership Vice President. The passion she has for the JLH was immediately evident and contagious, and that was just for a potential new member. I knew instantly from that conversation that this was an organization that I wanted to be involved with.

"Since then I have had the opportunity to meet many more incredible women that are a part of the JLH. I have learned more about their community involvement, past projects, current projects, and new projects.

"We select organizations whose values line up with those of our Foundation, which include scholarship, community service, and providing assistance to those in need. These are traits I have personally seen embodied by the women in the Junior League of Huntsville. These are also traits that are brought to life through BIRTHday Books, Butterfly, the many training opportunities, community grants, and others. I have seen the dedication members have to raising funds with Apple Annie.


JLH members have had an active fall promoting our impact area of literacy. Members had the opportunity to engage through community placements as well as unique community partnerships.

The **One on One: Let's Read Committee** hosted a medieval-themed Family Literacy Night at [Calvary Hill Public Library](#); the **Children First Committee** continued supporting Morris School with food packs and supply deliveries; and the **Rainbow Rhythm Band** performed at several events. The Provisional Class continued stuffing **BIRTHday Books** bags and hosted their first NICU meal.

On October 5th, the JLH was invited to [Huntsville Junior High School](#)'s service learning elective class to present on our community projects. Because the class has been studying nutrition, **Natalie Huff** and **Anne Vasile** discussed our partnership with Children First, gave statistics and information on the free and reduced lunch program in Huntsville City Schools, and talked about the importance of collaboration and funding for community non-profits. Teacher Lisa Kennedy and school counselor and JLH provisional member **Sarah Spear** shared with us the class's flow charts (pictured below) highlighting their ideal school snacks, and an idea for a lunchbox and snack collection service project. The class graciously took up a collection of non-perishable food for Children First, and hope to join us at a food packing night!



This year the JLH purchased 2,500 books to help sponsor [United Way of Madison County's Read for the Record Day](#), which took place on October 25th. The book, *Maybe Something Beautiful* by Isabel Campoy and Theresa Howell, illustrated by Rafael Lopez, tells the true story of the Urban Art Trail in San Diego, CA, through the eyes of a little girl, Mira. *Maybe Something Beautiful* was read aloud to every Pre-K, Kindergarten, and First Grade classroom in Madison County with the help of many community volunteers. The Junior League of Huntsville adopted [Ridgecrest Elementary School](#), and members gave their time to read to approximately 180 children; some even read the book twice because the children were so engaged! **One on One: Let's Read Chair Deborah Powell** sums it up perfectly: "You know what can make a cloudy day sunny? Getting 18 sweet, smiley hugs from 18 super sweet kids!" The Junior League is proud to help promote the importance of reading aloud to children, and we are grateful to the United Way for partnering with us.



The **Butterfly Project** had a great fundraiser and prom dress drive at [Yellowhammer Brewery](#) on November 8th. Yellowhammer donated 10% of the event's profits to the Butterfly Project - more than \$250! We also received a carload of dresses and accessories donations.

JLH members also attended a Give Back Night at [Kendra Scott's Bridge Street location](#) on December 14th. Thanks to Kendra Scott for their continued support of the League and the Butterfly Project! This event raised \$1,172.74!

The Butterfly committee is still accepting donation items and would LOVE more accessories donations. Items like shoes, clutches, and jewelry are very much needed!




Member-Centric JLH

Members have enjoyed numerous training opportunities over the past few months, and we look forward to beginning the year with Facilitation Training led by **Community VP-Elect** (and Certified Facilitator) **Bekah Schmidt** in January.



The JLH sent four delegates to an [Association of Junior Leagues International \(AJLI\) Organizational Development Institute Conference](#) in Little Rock, Arkansas in October. Hosted by the Junior League of Little Rock, delegates **Kristina Hendrix**, **Katie Kelley**, **Lain Littleton**, and **Kate Moon** attended sessions focused on Diversity and Inclusion, Fund Development, Infrastructure, and Governance, as well as mission-based training in key areas critical to the healthy functioning of the League.

League members attended a **Stewards of Children Training** at the [National Children's Advocacy Center](#) on October 30th. The training focused on teaching adults to prevent, recognize, and react responsibly to child sexual abuse.



On November 27th, members attended a **Drowning Prevention Training** focused on promoting drowning awareness, the risks inside your own home, and how it can be prevented.
